## WHEN TO USE

BI4DYNAMICS OR POWER BI	<p><b>BI4Dynamics</b> does job much better on complex structures of <b>Microsoft Dynamics AX/NAV</b> by using <b>T-SQL</b> and <b>data warehouse</b> architecture.</p> <p><b>Power BI</b> supports better <b>generic data sources with simple data structure</b> or when <b>predefined data source connector</b> satisfies business requirements, or when <b>special data model</b> needs to be developed quickly.</p> <p>POWER BI can be used in some scenarios to <b>extend data warehouse</b> functionality or to add additional sources much faster than BI4Dynamics.</p>
EXCEL OR POWER BI	<p>Use both.</p> <p>Excel (<b>desktop usage</b>): Excel is far better for <b>Ad-Hoc analysis</b> and business users are already familiar with Excel.</p> <p>Power BI (<b>mobile, web usage</b>): Interactive dashboards at your fingertips.</p>

	<p>This is by far the biggest advantage of DW architecture as with T-SQL developer can deliver almost every request. As intermediate layer between data source and analytics this concept may bring complexity.</p> <p>BI4Dynamics has advantage of <b>open data warehouse architecture</b> and flexibility of customizations that are delivered by <b>Metadata</b> based <b>Wizard</b>.</p>	<p>Power Query is a powerful <b>mashup query language</b> optimized for <b>building queries</b> that mashup data.</p>

## QUESTION

## ANSWER

<p><b>CAN WE CREATE DATA MODEL FOR AX/NAV WITH POWER BI?</b></p>	<p>Yes, but is not recommended.</p>
<p><b>WHAT CAN GO WRONG IF WE DEVELOP DATA MODEL IN POWER BI ON OUR OWN?</b></p>	<p>If you do it on your own, you will spend a lot of time and not come to a good data model.</p>
<p><b>WHAT CAN GO WRONG IF WE BUY DATA MODEL IN POWER BI?</b></p>	<p>If you buy a data model it will probably have less feature that BI4Dynamics data warehouse based.</p>
<p><b>WHAT ARE MOST COMMON ISSUES WITH DATA MODELLING AX?</b></p>	<p>Complexity; AX has 6000 to 7000 tables.  BI4Dynamics uses 200 AX tables.</p>
<p><b>WHAT ARE MOST COMMON ISSUES WITH DATA MODELLING NAV?</b></p>	<p>Complexity; NAV has 1000 to 1500 tables; Data is per company - this is big headache.  BI4Dynamics uses 150 NAV tables.</p>
<p><b>SHALL WE USE POWER BI OR EXCEL?</b></p>	<p>Both. Excel is good for ad hoc reporting and best tool for desktop. Power BI is used for mobile and web access</p>
